Dear Parent/Guardian

We pride ourselves at Birkdale Primary School on ensuring that we enable and provide the opportunity for every child in Key Stage 2 to be able to join an after school sports club and/or to participate in curriculum events, festivals

and competitions.

At Birkdale Primary, alongside the many clubs we offer over the course of a school year, there are three after school clubs where children play and compete at league and tournament level. These three clubs are Netball and Football (boys and girls) and this is why we hold trials in these **three clubs only**. Yet again, this year was overwhelmingly popular (over 70 children for a club with a capacity of 20). This year we have entered three teams into the Sefton football league to allow us to give more children opportunity to represent the school. Therefore competing against other schools for trophies. We do not have the resources or the staff to facilitate anymore football teams. Mrs Eden, Mr Gallagher and Mr Murphy give up their own time to deliver these opportunities to our children voluntarily. Any clubs and matches that take place after school are always on a voluntary basis.

Our sports team work tirelessly throughout the school year, not just in delivering our sports curriculum for the children, but also to deliver as many sporting opportunities as we can. This has been recognised by the School Games Awards and has resulted in the Platinum Award 2023-24, the highest accolade in primary sporting education, being achieved. This award underlines

all our efforts to be inclusive.

Given the size of our brilliant school, there are always going to be difficulties when selecting teams and clubs for various sports. We understand how disappointing it can be for your child if they are not chosen for what might be

their favourite sport.

All staff throughout the school work together to select children for sporting events that are suitable to their sporting ability whether this be at a developing, inspire, league or tournament level. We understand your child may play a sport outside of school but there are children who do not have this opportunity and as staff we see that they shine in their sports curriculum. Since returning to school in September, the sports team have received a

number of complaints which go against everything the staff here stand for. It should really go without saying, that all staff deliberate very carefully over these decisions together and dread having to let children down gently. Decisions are never taken lightly and are never with a disregard to their mental health and wellbeing. Unfortunately, we cannot always accommodate everyone for everything.

Please respect and understand the decisions that staff make as they are

often a lot more complicated than meets the eye.
