# TEXT MESSAGES .... PARENT MAIL

Currently we send text messages to parents which works for us at the moment, but it is limited in its use and limits the number of characters we can use in a message.

Last year we trialled a new system of communication with parents called Parent Mail.

Parent Mail enables us to send messages, just like we would send text messages, but it also enables us to send out documents, letters and extended news, keeping parents more up to date with what's happening in school.

It is our intention to ensure that all of our parents have access to **Parent Mail** through emails and, more conveniently, through the **Parent Mail app** that can be downloaded to your phone.

In this way you will be notified of messages and new information that is being sent out to parents.

We will, eventually, be phasing out our use of text messages so it's important that parents log on to Parent Mail and stay in touch!!

If you have signed up to Parent Mail already make sure that you have also downloaded the Parent Mail App (ISIS) to ensure that you have access to all that Parent Mail can offer.

If you haven't explored Parent Mail yet, contact the school office and we'll send you the 'invitation' to sign up.
